Trends in the community

- # of developers who have switched from programming to Windows and moved to Linux >29% (Evans Data)
 - 6.7% were Windows XP
 - 10.6% were Windows NT
 - 12.5% were Windows 95/98

OpenOffice.org developers:

- 20% consider themselves ISV developers
- 25% surveyed work for companies with more than 100 employees
- Windows and Linux considered equally important
- Over 16% want to contribute to macros development, 11% extending features via components, and 10% converting VBA macros




Trends – part 2

 - Office Suite of the Year OpenOffice.org (83.60%)



OpenOffice.org 1.1 Beta availability

- Stability / Bug fixes
- Improved MS Office interoperability
- Native PDF export, Flash export from presentations
- Macro Recorder, Database report wizard
- Accessibility Features
- Complex text layout

OpenOffice.org SDK to add capabilities

- Java APIs for cross platform capabilities (also C++, Basic, OLE Automation (VisualBasic, Delphi))
- Integrated into Netbeans and Sun ONE Studio
- Ability to add components to OpenOffice.org/StarOffice
- Over 900 page developer's guide

What's new?

- An OASIS Technical Committee to standardize on an open, office file format (Boeing, Corel, Arbortext, ...)
- New development process
 - Easier to get your contribution in
 - CVS always consistent
 - Only tested child workspaces get checked into the master workspace
 - Allows both OpenOffice.org and StarOffice to use the same master workspace thus improving binary compatibility
